HONG KONG MERCHANT SHIPPING INFORMATION NOTE

United Nations Sanctions (South Sudan) Regulation 2019 (Amendment) Regulation 2020

To : Shipowners, Ship Managers, Ship Operators and Masters

Summary

The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) gazetted the United Nations Sanctions (South Sudan) Regulation 2019 (Amendment) Regulation 2020 (L.N. 165 of 2020) (the 'Amendment Regulation') on 11 September 2020. The Amendment Regulation, which came into effect on the same date, to give effect to certain decisions in Resolution 2521 (2020) adopted by the Security Council of the United Nations on 29 May 2020.

1. The Amendment Regulation amends the UN Sanctions (South Sudan) Regulation 2019 (Cap.537CK) (principal Regulation) and came into effect on 11 September 2020.
2. The main provisions of the Amendment Regulation relate to the prohibition against:
 - (a) the supply, sale, transfer or carriage of arms or related materiel to the South Sudan;
 - (b) the provision of technical assistance, training or financial or other assistance related to military activities in certain circumstances;
 - (c) making available to, or for the benefit of, certain persons or entities any funds or other financial assets or economic resources;
 - (d) dealing with funds, or other financial assets or economic resources belonging to, or owned or controlled by, certain persons or entities; and
 - (e) entry into or transit through the HKSAR by certain persons.
3. Section 2 of the Amendment Regulation sets out certain provisions of the principal Regulation will expire at midnight on 31 May 2021.

5. Shipowners, ship managers, ship operators and masters of Hong Kong registered ships should abide by the regulations mentioned above.
